Dear St. John,

You have may have heard that saying, "The only constant in life is change." Even though this statement is true in most areas of life, we still tend to fight against it. Change is hard, even if we know it's coming. And, not all change is positive. But, change is inevitable and a part of life.

Recently, I was looking through pictures on my phone from five years ago, and I came across some I had taken of St. John's sanctuary and lobby. These pictures showed very different spaces than what we see today. When I saw those pictures, I was reminded of how much has changed at St. John in the last few years!

If you have been attending worship at St. John on Sundays over the past few months, you now are probably used to the new look and feeling of the lobby area. But, if you were walking into it for the first time, you might be in shock. Everything has changed! Walls are gone, space opened up, new furniture, new windows, new carpet, an elevator-lift, and more.

I hear regular positive comments about how nice everything looks and the new feeling of entering into St. John. The most common response I hear from visitors or people who haven't been in the building for a while is, "Wow! This is beautiful!" Some change is good.

Churches/spiritual communities that are open to change and are aware that sometimes change is necessary, and are aware that sometimes change comes whether we want it or not, are the churches that have the most positive impact on the wider community and on the people within their community. These churches are healthy in their life outlook and know that there should always be a balance between tradition and change. We ground ourselves in the spiritual and moral and wait for God's call to what is next.

Here's the good news: St. John is one of these churches! So much has changed recently in our physical building, but if you take a close look at our community life, you'll see that we have opened ourselves to many new ways of being a spiritual community, especially since the pandemic. We've found new ways to live out our mission through the Little Free Pantry, becoming a PADS site, and more. We've adapted our Sunday School program, enhanced our livestream and video worship opportunities, and have continued to support what we know we do well in our music program and more. I have also been preaching on topics that I feel are more challenging, in the good way, encouraging all of us to go deeper in our spirituality and understanding of God.

All of the above is what I love about St. John. I'm confident in St. John's future, whatever changes may come.

Message from Our Financial Secretary

The function of the Financial Secretary is to keep an accurate record of each donation. At St. John, we have three ways to donate money to the church: 1) the collection plate on Sunday morning or mail-in during the week, 2) on-line through our website, or 3) have your bank send a weekly or monthly donation.

At the present time, there are 34 active on-line givers. In addition to these 34 families, there are a few who give quarterly, semi-annually or annually via on-line transactions. There is a small fee for this type of giving, however, the consistent flow of money into the church is a great benefit for the church. If you use a credit card for donation, there is a larger fee, as the credit card companies create an additional charge for this service.

Every member and friend of the church who gives regularly has a number for identification. This number is used to enter each gift into the computer system. If you have forgotten your numbered envelopes, all you have to do is use a pew envelope with your name on that envelope and it will be credited to your account. I apologize to new friends and members who want envelopes and I have none to give. Somewhere in our construction the extra envelopes have gone astray. However, I have given you a number if you requested it, and I do record your offerings if I know it is from you.

For the 2023 year, we will be doing some reassigning of envelope numbers as we have only ordered 50 boxes of numbered envelopes. Therefore, people with numbers 51 through 100 will be receiving new numbers. This is possible due to so many families/individuals that give on-line who no longer need envelopes. Additionally, if you give monthly, quarterly or yearly, 52 envelopes are no longer needed.



St. John Pollinator Patch Update

It's November and the little pollinator patch planted this past June is still full of blooms and color! This little garden has exceeded expectations with many of the first year native plants setting blooms! Usually a native garden "sleeps" the first year spending all of its energy developing a

deep root system. The second year it "creeps" into developing flowers while continuing to grow its roots. It looks like our little garden skipped the sleeping stage. I've seen birds and bumble bees stopping by the garden and even a Monarch butterfly flying around the parking lot.

In November we will trim some of the flopping plants but will leave the flower heads and stems of most plants. To some people this may look messy but it is really important for the life cycle of our native birds,



bees and insects to leave the vegetation over the winter so these critters can survive the cold and emerge in the Spring. The seed heads provide food for the birds, the plant stems allow the solitary bee a safe place to sleep through the winter, and other vegetation protects the chrysalis of many varieties of butterflies. We are off to a great start. The pollinator patch will be full of life and diversity next Spring, Summer and Fall!

Capital Campaign Update

The Capital Campaign has been making steady progress over the last several months. We experienced a setback in July when our General Contractor suffered a significant medical issue which put him in the hospital for an extended period of time. Based on his prognosis of being unable to work for a time, we have taken up the task of finishing up the remaining work ourselves. The primary reason for moving forward this way was the wedding that was scheduled at St. John in early October. We weren't sure if our contractor would be able to resume work and complete the work prior to the wedding. We were fortunate that all of the heavy work was completed by him and that much of the remaining work was and will be finishing items such as wood trim and other similar work. We have also coordinated with the carpet layers to complete the installation of the carpeting and obtained the services of an electrician to finish the remaining electrical work. All of the new furniture has been set out in the narthex and lobby area and it looks great. It's also getting a lot of use on Sunday mornings. The fence around the air conditioning units was installed so we anticipate receiving final approval of that permit shortly. We have also had several recent meetings with the Village regarding the general permit and hope to obtain approval of that permit soon.

As a result of unanticipated expenses, we are projecting that we will be a little short in funds upon completion of the project. Our current total received and pledged amount (as of early October) is almost \$560,000. We are currently anticipating that the total project cost will be approximately \$595,000. We have paid out approximately \$564,000 to date with only two large ticket items remaining to be paid, which are the sanctuary doors and the final electricians invoice.

We thank all those who have contributed to the campaign. Thanks to you, we have been able to complete all of the goals that we had when we first started the campaign. The lobby area and sanctuary look great. The basement is finally ADA accessible thanks to the new lift. And we can worship in comfort during the hot days of summer. Fantastic accomplishments. If you haven't yet contributed to the campaign or would like to increase your pledge, we would welcome that so that we can make up the small shortfall in our work.

Finally, a huge thank you to Ed Heiberger, Steve Blye and Paul Frost and for their many hours that they have put in contributing to the success of this campaign.



Message from Christian Education

The Christian Education Committee of St. John celebrated the start of another school year with our Fall Fest Sunday on September 11, which was a huge success despite the rain. Starting in late October, the kids present at Sunday School will learn a couple of Christmas songs that they'll sing on a Sunday in December (Parents, more information will be sent out on this).

We are looking forward to a great school year. Our first event was pumpkin carving and a bouncy house on October 23, and we are excited to bring back in-person Trivia night on Saturday, November 12. Look out for more details on our other events, including pizza movie night.
