From Our Interim Pastor

Wang's Words

It's not the 70's.

I have fond memories of my church youth group in the 70's. We had a large group; we met for a couple of hours every Sunday night; we took trips; we were close. I had a great experience.

What I didn't have was - a cell phone, a computer, (though I did have a pretty cool purple transistor radio), multiple opportunities for extracurricular sports (especially as a girl), college-level high school classes....

You get my drift. It's a very different world. You know that. One thing I've heard over and over again in recent years in the church: "We need a youth group; we have to attract more youth."

We had a good thing in the 70's but it's not the 70's and getting youth to come hang out at the church on a Sunday night is no longer a realistic model. While I'm bursting your bubble – offering the "right" kind of music in worship isn't going to have them coming in droves either. It's not the 70's; we're not a mega-church. I apologize for being blunt. The best thing we can do with our youth is integrate them into the total life of the congregation and give them meaningful experiences within the context of a church family.

"We need more members; we need more young families." is another refrain I have heard over and over again in churches. Of course we want that – we love our church; we want to make sure it is here for generations to come. Focusing on the question "How can we get more members?" however, might just be a waste of our energy.

It's not the 70's; or the 50's; or even the 80's. People are not seeking out churches like they once did. People are moving away from regular worship attendance. It's been going on for a while, and we are all feeling the effects of it in our churches. The New York Times has done a series of articles this spring on the religious shift in America. In one article, they quote the authors of a book that will be released this August - "The Great Dechurching."* "About 15% of American adults living today have effectively stopped going to church." You could have guessed that. "But how do we get more members!?" you still ask. There is no easy answer, and again, it is probably the wrong question.

A more faithful question might be: "How do we live out our faith in this community and beyond? How do we love and serve those around us? How do we let people know they are loved?



LUTHERAN CHURCH OF THE CROSS FOOD PANTRY REPORT SPRING 2022

This year, throughout the first quarter [January, February, March], the Lutheran Church of the Cross Food Pantry has serviced 1,327 recipients which translates to helping feed nearly 4,000 (3,821) food insecure folks taking into account individuals served—the total of those residing in each recipient's home. What a blessing!

And, as the Easter season was recently celebrated, we wanted to mention that some long-time supporters of the LCC Pantry – Gregg & Betsy Duncan – again donated their specialty gift of numerous bags of jelly beans that we were able to distribute during the two weeks preceding Easter Sunday. Another blessing – and we thank them so much for always remembering the Pantry and its many recipients at this time of year!

ACTIVITIES

In mid-May on Saturday the 13th, the National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC) will again hold its Post Office Food Drive – *Stamp Out Hunger* – that they had restarted last year after a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic. In 2022 our pantry was the beneficiary of nearly 10,000 pounds of non-perishable food items due to the hard work and coordination of the NALC and their local branch at the Arlington Heights Post Office. We so appreciate volunteers from the pantry and surrounding area who help sort and box up the food at our end so that we can put it to good use over the remaining spring and also the summer months as we will do so again this year!

Also, we'd like to mention that while we have enjoyed the past six years as co-directors of the Pantry here at Lutheran Church of the Cross, it's time to turn over the reins to new blood. So...during the next few months, the Pantry will be transitioning to new leadership – Katherine Ehlert, the Pastor here at LCC, and her very good friend and colleague that she has worked on many projects with, Micki Fayhee, will become Co-Directors. Please welcome them as they begin a new venture!

To our volunteers – stay safe and healthy and we thank you for your continued help throughout the year! To our supporters – whether you provide monetary donations or drop off donations of food – we appreciate every effort. Please know that the food insecure folks in the area benefit tremendously by your generosity! Thank you, thank you! May God bless you all!


Prayers of Concern & Prayers of Joy

We are thrilled to announce that the construction portion of the Capital Campaign is completed! All work by contractors is now finished. A huge thank you to several people including **Bob Burdick, Steve Blye, Paul Frost, and many others** for the work they contributed to the project. A special thank you to **Ed Heiberger** for the many hours of work and contractor coordination he contributed to this project.

To celebrate the success in achieving the Campaign's original project goals, the Capital Campaign Committee will be hosting an open house on Wednesday, September 27, at St. John. Your generosity and financial commitment made it all possible! Save the date and look for more information about this very special event in the coming weeks.

We can be proud of the many projects and building improvements completed as part of this very successful and ambitious campaign including:

- Air conditioning in the sanctuary and throughout the entire first floor
- New seating and carpeting in the sanctuary
- An automated lift between the first floor and the basement
- A beautiful new gathering room along with new lighting, carpeting and furniture in the church lobby
- New windows in the pastor's office and in the gathering room
- New doors into the sanctuary, the east stairwell, and the northwest exterior door
- Additional improvements and enhancements throughout the first floor and balcony

The total cost of the Campaign was \$623,987, approximately \$74,000 more than we initially anticipated. A letter was mailed to the congregation in June providing additional detail about the Campaign and the various reasons for the increased costs. We would ask that you prayerfully consider an additional donation to the campaign to help reduce the shortfall. We have begun to pay back the loan from the Endowment Fund and will continue to pay it back as remaining pledges and additional contributions come in.

We look forward to celebrating with you in September! Again, thank you for your patience and generous financial support in helping us to reach our project goals.
